COVID POLICY: NATIONAL RECREATIONAL FISHING SUMMIT

AS GUIDELINES CHANGE, THE BELOW LISTED PROTOCOLS WILL BE UPDATED.

UPDATED: 03/25/22

As of March 25th, 2022: Arlington, VA is designated a LOW Community Level by the CDC.

Registered participants/attendees <u>**DO NOT**</u> have to provide the Certification of Vaccination Form in order to attend the event, as long as the region remains in a LOW status. This policy will change if the Community Level changes to MEDIUM or HIGH.

There are currently <u>no</u> mask mandates, regardless of vaccination status. People can wear a mask based on personal preference, informed by personal level of risk.

Any further changes will be updated to participants/attendees via email correspondence or in-person event announcements. The conference organizers will continue adherence to all federal, state, and county guidelines.

DUTY TO SELF-MONITOR:

<u>Prior to the Summit:</u> Recognizing that COVID infection is often consistent with cold-like symptoms, anyone who starts to feel ill or sick leading up to the Summit should avoid attending the event.

<u>During/Post Summit</u>: Participants and volunteers agree to self-monitor for signs and symptoms of COVID-19 (again, symptoms typically include cold-like symptoms, fever, cough, and shortness of breath, etc.) during this event and contact event planners at <u>RecFishSummitInfo@asmfc.org</u> if they experience symptoms of COVID-19 within 3 days after participating or volunteering with this event.

ASSUMPTION OF RISK:

Because COVID-19 is extremely contagious and is spread mainly from person-to-person contact, event planners/hosts cannot guarantee that its participants, volunteers, partners, or others in attendance will not become infected with COVID-19.

By attending this event, you acknowledge and understand that participation includes possible exposure to, and illness from, infectious diseases including, but not limited to, COVID-19. While particular rules and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of serious illness and death does exist.

If you recently tested positive for COVID-19, ensure that you are outside the timeline of CDC recommended quarantine/testing prior to attending.
