2017 River Herring Stock Assessment Update

- Recommendation in 2012 assessment was an update in 5 years and benchmark in 10 years
- Short time series of beneficial monitoring efforts due to Amendment 2
- Need to develop robust stock-specific ocean bycatch estimates
- Proposed move from 2018 to 2017 due to NOAA Fisheries revisiting Endangered Species Act listing determination made in 2013



2018 American Shad Stock Assessment

- Assessment update with the potential to change to a benchmark assessment
- Short time series of beneficial monitoring efforts due to Amendment 3
- Need to develop robust stock-specific ocean bycatch estimates
- Proposed move from 2017 to 2018 to accommodate River Herring Assessment



Stock Assessment Timetables

- Webinar with Technical Committees and Stock Assessment Subcommittees in late May
 - Need to repopulate Stock Assessment Subcommittees
- Joint Data Workshop in Fall 2016
- Efforts following Data Workshop focused on completing River Herring Assessment in 2017
- Upon completion of the River Herring Assessment, efforts will focus on completing American Shad Assessment in 2018



River Herring Data Standardization Workshop

Background



- May 2015
 - The TC and members of the TEWG recommended to the Board that a workshop on data collection and standardization be conducted
 - Focus on fishery independent survey programs
 - Recommendation follows research needs outlined in 2012 River Herring Assessment





Data Standardization Workshop

- November 2015
 - 2.5 day workshop in Baltimore, MD
 - 30 participants including 15 state agencies, 2 federal agencies (NOAA & USFWS), 1 Federally recognized Tribe, and Canada DFO
 - Each agency provided monitoring program information and overview





Results

- Recommendations made by the group by survey design type
 - Highlighting resource needs and urgency
- Recommendations on biological sampling
- Workshop Report now available online

 - 2015 Summary is almost complete






2015 Shad and River Herring FMP Review and Compliance

River Herring Passage Counts

- ME, NH, MA, RI, CT, PA, MD, and SC
- Coastwide: 2.86 million river herring
- Coastwide: 747,793 shad





Coastwide Stocking

Occurring in ME, MA, PA, NC, SC

American shad: 26.4 million

Alewife: 296,267





Sturgeon Interactions

101 interactions were reported

• RI, CT, NJ, NC, SC, GA

 All released alive, with the exception of one fatality.





De minimis

Shad

• ME, NH, MA, FL

River herring

• NH, MA, FL

 All of these states meet the requirements for de minimis.
