

Report from the January 4th Atlantic Menhaden Technical Committee Meeting

Introduction



- TC met via conference call to review a conservation equivalency proposal from the state of MD
 - A second proposal was offered after the call from PRFC, providing the same request and supporting information
- A brief review of the proposal was given to the group
 - In general looking to allow 2 bycatch possessions to be taken on a single vessel with 2 permitted fishermen

Introduction



- Brief review (cont.)
 - Proposal only applies to pound net fishermen who must possess appropriate licensure
 - Pound net fishery for menhaden is limited entry in MD (and PFRC), limiting opportunity for expansion
 - MD (and PRFC) conclude the proposal won't result in increases in harvest, and allows for efficiencies

Technical Committee Comments

 TC agreed by consensus that MD (and PRFC's) proposals will not adversely impact the biological status of Atlantic menhaden

 Noted that the proposal would most likely not significantly change the harvest currently occurring

Technical Committee Comments

 Limited entry program for pound nets is expected to limit potential expansion

 Given current status of menhaden (not overfished or experiencing overfishing), and limited amount of landings occurring under bycatch allowance (~ 1% coastwide), the TC does not have biological concern with the conservation equivalent proposals

Technical Committee Comments

- TC recommends continued monitoring of bycatch landings coastwide to ensure an expansion of harvest can be addressed if it occurs
- TC also recommends the Board consider further evaluation of the bycatch landings on a coastal scale as it develops Amendment 3 to the menhaden FMP
 - Bycatch portion of the harvest can currently expand
 - Assessing upper bound of this expansion and its potential impacts to the fishery/stock status should be considered while developing the amendment

LEC Review

- Conference Call on January 7, 2016
- 18 enforcement members participating
- Reviewed MD proposal
 - 12,000lb bycatch limit (two permitted individuals)
- Subsequent consideration of PRFC proposal
- LEC memorandum to board




LEC Comments

- No specific concerns raised about proposal
 - Similar provision in 2013 in MD
- A general concern was raised
 - Unforeseen loopholes could increase bycatch violations
 - LEC would like opportunity to evaluate after one year

Draft Amendment 3 Motion



Move to proceed under Option 2 which initiates a PID in 2017 and includes ERPs and allocation with the CESS Report to be implemented in 2018

Draft Amendment 3



- Two major topics:
 - Ecological Reference Points
 - Revisiting Allocation
- Two rounds of public input:
 - Public Information Document in 2017
 - -Amend 3 in later 2017
- Aiming for implemented in 2018

Allocation Considerations



- Board WG has potential list of allocation options compiled
- CESS Socioeconomic analysis available in early 2017
- ASMFC is working on finalizing contract for work now
- Intent is for socioeconomic analysis to help allocation discussion

Ecosystem Reference Points



- Current Biological Reference Points
 - -approved for management use
 - —not yet part of a management document
- Ecosystem Reference Points
 - Some ERPs available now, but BERP WG does not recommend using for management
 - BERP is developing ERPs
 - Timeline is 2019-2020 so not for Amend 3, but possible adaptive management

Draft Amendment 3 Timeline



Potential Timeline

- PID for Comment Nov 2016
- PID Public Comment Period Nov-Feb
- PID guides Draft A3 Feb 2017
 - Socioeconomic analysis released
 - PDT develops Draft A3 Feb-Aug
- Draft A3 for Comment Aug 2017
- Draft A3 Public Comment Period Aug-Nov
- Finalize A3 at 2017 Annual Meeting
- Implementation likely in 2018.

Total Allowable Catch



- 187,880 mt TAC for 2015 and 2016
- Stock Assessment Update in 2017
- Need to set fishery specifications for 2017
