Federal Legislative Update

Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Program 2013 Sequester Amounts Returned

The Department of Interior announced in March that it will release \$18.5 million in Sport Fish Restoration Trust Fund funding that was withheld in 2013 as a result of the sequester. The total disbursement for 2014 totals \$325.7 million, including the sequestered amount from 2013. The 2014 disbursement is \$34.1 million lower than 2013 due to lower domestic fishing equipment excise tax receipts. Following are the 2014 apportionments of the 15 ASMFC member states:

The Sport Fish Restoration Program provides grant funding directly to states for fishery projects, boating access, and aquatic education. It is funded through excise taxes on fishing equipment, motorboat and small engine fuels, and import duties. Funds are distributed to states based on a formula which includes area and the number of paid license holders. Additionally, the Dingell-Johnson Sport Fish Restoration Program requires that each year \$200,000 from the Sport Fish Restoration Trust Fund be allocated to each of the four fisheries commissions. The Sport Fish Restoration Program reimburses up to 75 percent of the cost of each eligible project, while state fish and wildlife agencies contribute a minimum of 25 percent.

Fishing Safety Funding

On April 1, 2014, the House of Representatives passed H.R. 4005, the Coast Guard and Maritime Transportation Act of 2014, which authorizes funding for the Coast Guard for 2015 and 2016. Included in the legislation was a an amendment authored by Rep Bill Keating (D-MA) that reauthorized the Fishing Safety Training and Fishing Safety Research grant programs. The programs, first established in the 2010, provide access to training resources as well as research to improve safety on fishing boats. Rep Keating has also introduced a stand-alone bill, H.R. 4025, the Fishing Safety Training and Research Act, which extends authorizations for both safety training programs through 2025. H.R. 4005 is currently awaiting action in the Senate.

House Natural Resources Committee Chairman to Retire

Rep. Doc Hastings (R-WA), the chairman of the House Natural Resources Committee, announced on February 13, 2014 that he will not seek reelection in 2014. Hastings has represented his Washington district since 2004 and assumed Chairmanship of the Natural Resources Committee in 2011. Hastingsøreplacement as Chair of the Committee remains up in the air should Republicans hold a majority in the House, as many are currently predicting. The second-ranking Republican, Rep. Don Young (R-AK), has already served the maximum six years as chairman of the committee and is not likely to serve again due to House Republican Conference rules. The committee's third-ranking Republican, Rep. Louie Gohmert (R-TX), is likely to be passed over for the Chairmanship due to his rocky relationship with House leadership. At this point, the front-runner to replace Hastings is Rep. Rob Bishop (R-UT). The race for the next Natural Resources Committee Chair will heat up after the general election in November.

Seafood Sustainability

In December 2013, MAFAC delivered its recommendations for a NOAA sustainable seafood certification program. NMFS is currently accepting public comments on MAFAC® recommendation through May 28, 2014. MAFAC recommends that any certification program focus on a business-to-business certification, with an audited chain-of-custody verification. Of particular note to the Commission, MAFAC recommends that seafood caught in federal waters be certified first, followed by state fisheries, then aquaculture. Additionally, the Senate® draft Magnuson-Stevens Act Reauthorization bill contains provisions for voluntary sustainability labeling. Briefly, a producer, processor, importer, exporter, distributor, or seller could use a õSustainably Caughtö label on any fish product as long as the fishery has a federal FMP; is not being overfished; and meets traceability requirements.

As previously noted, the Commission is concerned that any certification available to federally managed species and not those managed by the states could disadvantage the states from a marketing perspective.

Catch Shares Appropriations Rider

Rep Steve Southerland (R-FL) has requested the FY 2015 Commerce, Justice, Science, Appropriations bill contain a policy rider barring funding for the implementation of new catch share programs. Rep Southerland has championed this rider for the last several years and has also proposed it as an amendment on the House floor. The House and Senate Appropriations Committees have yet to release the text of the 2015 Commerce, Justice, Science, Appropriations bills.

Fluke Fairness Act Included in Senate MSA Reauthorization Bill

Senator Chuck Schumer (D-NY) announced that the Senate MSA Reauthorization bill will include the text of S. 1757 ó the Fluke Fairness Act. As previously noted, Senator Schumer introduced the legislation on November 21, 2013. The bill essentially requires the Commission and the Mid-Atlantic Fishery Management Council to adopt a regional management system. Specifically, it would require that the summer flounder FMP be modified within one year to reflect the best available science; consider changes in the migratory behavior of summer flounder in establishing distribution of the commercial and recreational catch quotas; prioritize regional or coastwide management measures for summer flounder that comply with the Magnuson Act& National Standards on equity and fairness; and prohibit the allocation of commercial or recreational catch quotas for summer flounder on a state-by-state basis using historical landings data that do not reflect a state& participation in the current summer flounder fishery.

U.S. Senate Approves Two Treaties to Combat Pirate Fishing

On April 3, 2014, the U.S. Senate approved two international treaties to combat illegal, unregulated, and unreported (IUU) fishing ó the Port State Measures Agreement and the Convention on the Conservation and Management of High Seas Fisheries Resources in the North Pacific Ocean.

The Port State Measures Agreement, which the United Nations adopted in 2009, applies to foreign-flagged vessels calling on ports in any country that is a party to the agreement. Under its provisions, port officials who conclude that a vessel has a known or suspected record of illegal fishing would turn away the vessel or subject it to immediate inspection. The Agreement will take effect once 25 parties ratify it; the United States is the 11th party to do so, joining nine other countries and the European Union. The Convention on the Conservation and Management of High Seas Fisheries Resources in the North Pacific Ocean would create an international organization to regulate fishing in international waters of the North Pacific to protect fish habitat.
