Handling a Motion

(Member is recognized)

1. A member makes a motion

2. Another member seconds

("If there is no second, the question will not be considered

3. Chair 'states' the question

("It is moved and seconded...")
(Don't start discussion until clarified;
Use a speaker's list to keep track)

4. Members debate the motion

(Enforce rules of debate & decorum)

5. Chair 'puts' the question

(Allows higher ranking motions, clearly establishes what vote is on)

6. Chair takes vote

(Choose the best voting method)
(Announce which side 'has it')
(Announce if motion passes or fails)
(Announce effect of vote)

Rules of Debate

- 1. The maker has the right to speak first
- 2. The chair should alternate 'pro' & con as much as possible
- 3. Each person only has the right to speak *once* to each debatable motion
- 4. A person may only speak a second time if there is no one wishing to speak who has not yet spoken
- 5. Once a person has spoken twice on a motion, they have exhausted their right to speak for that day.
- 6. Debate can be limited by a special rule or by a motion to limit debate.
